DO YOU KNOW?

What do I need to do to turn in my quilts?

Each quilt should be in it's own bag (a pillowcase makes a great bag). The bag should have a clear pocket attached and a picture of the quilt should be in the pocket. Thin, clear plastic can be purchased at JoAnn's or other craft stores and stitched on to make the pocket. The picture helps ensure the quilt gets put back in the proper bag for return after the show.

Make sure your quilt has a sleeve on the back so we can hang it easily. Instructions on sleeves are on the website under Quilt Show.
