What I heard over and over were two themes: strive for smooth and even stitches in quilting and make sure corners are 90 degrees. Much the same as what Brenda Jeschke told us when she spoke at our January meeting.

When you joined the Guild, did you realize that you had taken on an obligation to support our charitable efforts? As members, we are expected to turn in at least one, and preferably two, charity quilts per year. I know I’m behind, but I’m working on my two and plan to have them in early this year. One suggestion made to me was to plan to donate one during my birthday month. After trying to meet at JoAnn’s for a month, WE ARE BACK AT KROGER’S. There just wasn’t enough space when all of us came to sew. So why don’t you join us any Tuesday from 8:30 until around noon and help us make quilts for the elderly and Linus. Just bring your sewing supplies and all the rest is furnished.

We were pleasantly surprised at the turn in of quilts at the February meeting. There were 8 Linus quilts, 1 crocheted lap quilt and 6 adult quilts. Thank You also to the donation of fabric from Leah Yarbrough and Joy Denk and to the 19 kits that were picked up by guild members. This early in the year puts us well on our

way to being able to provide quilts to at least 2 nursing homes.

Don’t forget that Linus also wants premie quilts—25” x 25” square—cotton on one size and flannel on the other OR both sides can be flannel. The age of kids at Texas Children’s Hospital range from premie to age 21—both boys and girls—so think about this when you make a quilt for Linus. The size of quilt can be as small as the premies to as large as 40 x 60 for the older kids. Keep up the good work,
