Health has been an issue this month in our family. If you haven't heard, our youngest daughter, Debbie, went into cardiac arrest on January 8 with a less than 20 percent chance of survival and a second time on January 12 in cardiac ICU. She is well on the road to recovery now and residing temporarily with us where I can keep a close watch on her. She had no warning that her heart had weakened so substantially. There is a history of heart trouble on both sides of our family, so both daughters have a good chance of potential problems. I highly encourage you to look closely at your family's health history and make sure that you keep on top of any potential problems that might be there. I can assure you that spending ten days in cardiac ICU holding your comatose daughter's hand is not how you want to spend quality quilting time!

Can you believe that our quilt show is just a month away? Our judges are in place and ready to go, the Basket and Quilt Bonanza has some great items for you to win, and the Market has a lot of outstanding items for your selection when shopping. We are receiving fun and useful door prizes, and our volunteer list is growing. Remember that you can get in free to the show with your two hours

*“Sort, Sew, Slice Through your Scraps”*

We have a change of speakers for our February meeting. Unfortunately Marcia Kaylackie had to cancel due to a shoulder injury and upcoming surgery. Elizabeth Broussard has graciously accepted my plea to step in and present her program on how you can create new fabric from scraps.

Liz Broussard has been fondling fabric since a small girl, so she has been holding onto scraps for a long time. Having discovered quilting in 1989, she put garment sewing aside to let quilting become her passion.

Specialty rulers, chopping up existing blocks and scraps are some of her favorite topics.

You might be a scrapaholic if:

- You toss out only miniscule bits of fabric.
- You dig though someone else’s refuse at sew-ins in case they threw out a scrap larger than one-half inch.
- You have yardage consuming more than one closet, yet you doggedly will not toss out any scraps.
- You accept scraps from others because you feel you are performing “fabric rescue”.

Liz’s lecture will show you that turning scraps into usable fabric to make quilted treasures is do-able and fun!

## PRISMATIC STAR QUILTING CLASS

West Houston Quilter's Guild

April 22 and 29, 2017; 9:30 am to 4:00 pm  
Quiltworks, 9431 Jones Rd, Houston, TX 77065



This easy to create pattern is made with one (1) 48 Strip Hoffman Batik Bali Pop (1 set of any Quiltworx Bali Pops 48 strip set). Attendees will need to select their background material for the second class. I did find it easier to select the background fabric after I put together my diamonds so I could see the color play and whether I liked it or not. I also selected a different color, other than black, for the border around the diamonds based on my background fabric.

The first day will be instruction in the morning on cutting the strips and placing them in the proper order for piecing. This is so crucial to the strip piecing as attendees begin to stitch the diamonds together. Taking the time at the beginning will reduce frustration later on in construction.

The second half of the first day, we begin piecing the diamonds together using the strip piecing method with paper. Sounds intimidating, but it's not!

There will be some homework as attendees will need to have at least four of the diamonds, but preferably all eight diamonds, put together to begin diamond border and background fabric selection and begin putting the top together in the second class session.

The second class day will provide instruction for cutting the background fabric and beginning piecing all the parts together.

The class fee includes the Marti Michell Smart Corner tool, a \$10.00 value. Attendees will be glad to have the tool as it makes the diamonds go together beautifully!

I will also have door prizes to hand out during this two-day event – never know what kind of goodies I can find!!

The price for this two-day event is \$100.00 – this includes 12 hours of class time and the Smart Corner tool.

For an additional \$20, a \$29.00 value, attendees can purchase the Prismatic Star Pattern from me.

If you've wanted to make this great pattern from Judy Niemeyer, take advantage of this opportunity to learn new techniques, learn from my mistakes, laugh – and win prizes!

### CANCER MOONSHOT RIBBON QUILT PROJECT

Is a Quilt that will be 363ft or 110m long and 10" wide inspired by a cancer ribbon and so is long and thin. The length will be the same as a Saturn 5 rocket; the rocket that was launched to the moon a generation ago.

A total of 460 blocks will be required to complete the quilt and the 8" circle within the block can be the makers interpretation of the moon or any design. Blocks to be sent by the End of March 2017.
