



Donation Quilt - "Spring Morn"



The approximately 76" x 80" quilt was made with Aunt Grace type fabrics which were donated by members of the West Houston Quilter's Guild. Kits were put together by Jean Ann Byant and Karen Coffey and guild members completed the 9-patch blocks and half-square triangles. Jean Ann did the applique and with the help of Karen assembled the quilt top. Judith Washburn donated her quilting of our beautiful quilt. Tickets are \$1.00 each or 6 for \$5.00. The winning ticket will be drawn on Saturday afternoon, March 1, 2025. You need not be present to win.

Door Prizes – Our generous vendors and quilt friends have donated a number of door prizes to our show. You received a ticket with your entry which you will take to the Door Prize Table.

Quilt Show Etiquette

The quilts in our show are all on loan—privately owned treasures that the exhibitors have agreed to publicly display for your pleasure. We ask that you follow a few rules to safeguard these treasures and to make the show an enjoyable experience.


Do not touch the quilts, no matter how tempting. If you would like a closer look, please use the plastic glove given to you at the entrance. Natural oils, dirt, even acids found on people's fingers may increase the deterioration of textile fabrics.

Do not bring food or drinks into the quilt exhibition area. There is a concession area available for your enjoyment in the atrium.

Control children at ALL times. Unsupervised children will be given a puppy to take home. No smoking.

Photography is allowed in the exhibit area. Many of the quilts on display are true works of art and are original designs. Please honor that by getting permission before posting any photographs on the Web. Please get permission from individual vendors before photographing their products. Many have protective copyrights.

Quilt Awards

Quilts are judged in a specific category. Awards include:

Awards for Merit – 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place winners are determined by our show judges.

Best of Show – All three judges select the winner of this award.

Judge's Choice – Each judge picks their favorite quilt.

President's Choice – Selected by the president of the guild.

Guild Challenge Award – Guild members voted for their favorite at the January guild meeting.

Viewers' Choice – Show visitors vote for their favorite quilt. Votes are tallied and ribbon attached to winning quilt around 1:00 on Saturday.

Viewers' Choice Ballots

As you stroll through the show, admiring all of the wonderful quilts, we invite you to vote for your favorite entry. Ballots are available at the Admission Table. Only a numbered entry may be chosen. Please deposit your ballot in the container located at the Admissions Table before you leave for the day.

The Viewer's Choice Award will be announced on Saturday afternoon just prior to the close of the show.

Brief Biographies of our Judges

Elizabeth A. Broussard

Liz Broussard was born in Cecilia, Louisiana, obtained a Bachelor of Science in Computer Science from the University of Southwestern Louisiana and moved to Houston, Texas in 1983. Having done garment sewing from a young age, quilting grabbed her interest in 1989. Wearable art and fiber art soon followed and stoked her desire to study both quilt and surface design. It is evident that scraps, dyeing, rusting and upcycling demanded their inclusion in her passion. Her quilts have hung in the Concert Hall of Festival Hill and in Copper Shade Tree Gallery, Round Top, Texas. Small art pieces have been juried into exhibitions at Texas Art Alliance Center of Clear Lake, Houston Center for Contemporary Craft, Copper Shade Tree Gallery, Round Top, and local quilt shows in Houston. Her work has been featured in the books Simple Strategies for Block-Swap Quilts, Patchwork-Play Quilts, both by Lynn Roddy Brown, and Color Play (Second Edition) by Joen Wolfrom and the magazine, Fabric Trends, Issue #3.

Lois Kindley

Candidate of the NACQJ Program

I am a veteran fiber artist and have a passion for quilt making. I have been sharing the love of quilting for over 40 years. I've been active in the quilting world, lecturing, designing patterns, and teaching children, adults, and even inmates quilting. After a considerable amount of success, I have become a highly awarded quilter, having pieces exhibited in national shows and longarming for others who have competed at that level as well. My heart longs to positively encourage quilters! I desire to share my love of quilting and see others succeed. I know entrants have worked very hard to complete their tops and are willing to have them judged. I aim to inspire you to continue creating and entering quilts into competitions. After all, it's a great way to spark the creativity of others!

Judging Philosophy: I strive to award excellence in design, workmanship, and creativity. I desire to give positive feedback to quilters so that they're encouraged to continue in our shared love of quilting. It's my honor to serve as one of your judges. I thank you for this opportunity.

Shawn Sickle

Candidate of the NACQJ Program

Quilting was something that Shawn Sickle admired from a far while she was busy raising a family and running a business. Her mother was an avid quilter, and they would regularly go to quilt shows over the years. Then in 2010 the opportunity came to make a quilt for her first granddaughter and the rest is history, as they say. That first quilt sparked an interest that has since blossomed into a passion. In 2018 she was introduced to longarm quilting which expanded her repertoire and catapulted the progression into quilt judging. Since becoming a candidate of the National Association of Certified Quilt Judges (NACQJ) in 2022 Shawn has been actively judging and working in shows throughout the country. She was a finalist in the 2023 and 2024 Cherrywood Fabric Challenge and the 2023 Hoffman Fabric Challenge, as well as being juried into two Studio Art Quilt Associates (SAQA) exhibits. She was also recently selected to serve on the Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo Quilt Show Committee. Shawn is driven to pursue a judging certification through the NACQJ to share her passion for the craft while empowering and encouraging fellow quiltmakers.

Explanation Of Quilt Descriptions

Master/Professional: Quilt entrant earns money from quilting (creating patterns, writing books, teaching, making or quilting quilts for others for pay).

Artisan: Quilting is a hobby, and no money is earned from it.

Bed size: A quilt is intended to be used on a bed or cover a person (lap or throws). Not intended to be displayed as art/wall hanging/home décor item.

Small: Any quilt with every side less than 75".

Large: Any quilt which is 75" or larger on any side.

One person: The same person who pieced the quilt is also the quilter.

Two persons: The quilter is different from the person who pieced the quilt.
